## COURSE OF STUDY.

### GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

Latin, Greek, and English Grammars; Latin Prose, Mair's Introduction, Arithmetic, Geography, Latin Reader, Cæsar, Ovid, Sallust, Jacobs' Greek Reader.

### FRESHMAN CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—Virgil's *Æneid*, Translation of English into Latin, Xenophon's *Cyropædia*, Roman Antiquities, (Adams') Algebra, (Davies' edition of Bourcier's.)

SECOND TERM.—Livy, Translation of English into Latin, Græca Majora, Greek Antiquities, Algebra Continued.

### SOPHOMORE CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—Virgil's *Georgics* and *Bucolics*, Cicero's Orations, Homer's *Iliad*, Davies' Legendre's Geometry.

SECOND TERM.—Horace, Græca Majora, Young's Trigonometry, (Plain and Spherical,) Surveying, Heights and Distances, Spherical Projections, Navigation, Nautical Astronomy.

### JUNIOR CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—Cicero's Orations, Græca Majora, (Philosophical and Critical Extracts.) Whately's Rhetoric, Whately's Logic, Young's

Analytical Geometry, (Classic Sections and Analytical Geometry of three dimensions.)

SECOND TERM.—Tacitus, *Græca Majora*, (Dramatic Extracts,) Evidences of Christianity, Political Economy, Young's Differential Calculus.

#### SENIOR CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—*Juvenal*, *Græca Majora*, (Dramatic Extracts,) Mental Philosophy, Chemistry, Young's Integral Calculus, Olmsted's Natural Philosophy, (commenced.)

SECOND TERM.—Petrus, Cicero de Officiis, *Græca Majora*, (Odes, &c.,) Moral Philosophy, Constitution of the United States and National Law, Olmsted's Natural Philosophy, (finished,) Astronomy, Geology.

There is a regular exercise in reading or declamation, once a week, continued through the whole course,—the Senior and Junior Classes delivering original speeches.

#### Commencement—Vacations—Examinations.

The Annual Commencement will be held on the last Thursday of September, in each year. An examination of each class will take place at the close of each term. The College year is divided into two terms of five months each. The first commences on the first Monday in November and terminates on the last Thursday in March. The second commences on the first Monday in May, on the last Thursday in September.

#### TUITION.

The Tuition Fee is \$12.00 per session in the College Proper, and \$12.00 in the Preparatory. As it is very desirable that students should enter at the beginning of a session, to commence their studies with their respective classes, no deduction from the tuition fee will be made in favor of any who may enter after the commencement of a session or a term, but before the first two months of it have expired. Those who may enter after the first two months of a session, will be charged in proportion to the part of it that may then remain.

#### EXPENSES.

It is impossible to make an accurate estimate of the expenses of a student. Much depends on his previous tastes and habits, and on the responsibility to which a parent or a guardian may hold him for the expenditure of the money with which he may be entrusted. Comfortable rooms in the College buildings may be occupied by the students, with no expense but that of keeping them in proper repair. Board and washing is from \$1.75 to \$2.25 per week. Students who room in private houses, and are furnished with fuel, &c. &c.

pay from \$337½ to \$360 per week. Beneficiaries of any education society are only charged \$3.00 per session for tuition; and any young man willing to pursue his studies for the Gospel Ministry, by furnishing testimonials of his character and standing as to piety, talents, and indigence, can procure a Scholarship of \$60 per annum, to enable him to defray the expenses of his education.

### GENERAL RULES.

All students are required to be present at Prayer in the College Chapel; to recite a Bible lesson on Sabbath, and to attend preaching once on that day; to avoid all profaneness and vice of every species; to observe in all their departments those principles of benevolence and integrity, which are essential to the comfort of every well regulated community; to exhibit diligence and energy in their studies, and to abstain from every thing that tends to injure their own interests or their general welfare.
