Some of the Western Colleges contain few students pursuing a regular Collegiate course; and in the Catalogues of such Institutions no distinct class of Irregulars appears, because nearly all are Irregulars. A College may consequently appear very flourishing in its number of attendants, when it may really have scarcely any students pursuing the Collegiate course.

## COURSE OF STUDIES.

## PREPARATORY.

Latin, Greek, and English Grammars; Latin Prose; Mair's Introduction; Arithmetic; Geography; Jacob's Latin Reader (by Anthon); Caesar, Ovid, Sallust, Virgil's *Aeneid*, Jacob's Greek Reader.

## FRESHMAN CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—Cicero's Orations, *Græca Majora*, (The Historical Extracts,) Roman Antiquities (Adams'), Algebra, (Davies' edition of Bourdon's.)

SECOND TERM.—Livy, *Græca Majora*, (Historical Extracts and *Memorabilia* finished,) Algebra finished, and Geometry, (Davies' Legendre) begun.

## SOPHOMORE CLASS.

FIRST TERM.—Horace, Homer's *Iliad*, Geometry finished.

SECOND TERM.—Cicero de *Officiis*, or Terence; *Græca Majora*, (Oratorical Extracts and Extracts from Plato,) Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Heights and Distances, Spherical Projections, Navigation, Nautical Astronomy, Surveying.

### JUNIOR CLASS.

**FIRST TERM.**—Cicero de Oratore, Græca Majora, (Epic Extracts,) Whately's Logic, Whately's Rhetoric, Young's Analytical Geometry, (Conic Sections and Analytical Geometry of three dimensions.)

**SECOND TERM.**—Juvenal, Græca Majora, (Dramatic Extracts,) Evidences of Christianity, (Alexander's with Lectures,) Say's Political Economy, Davie's Calculus.

### SENIOR CLASS.

**FIRST TERM.**—Tacitus, Græca Majora, (Dramatic Extracts finished,) Mental Philosophy, (Upham's with Lectures,) Chemistry, Young's Mechanics, or Olmstead's.

**SECOND TERM.**—Persius, Quintilian, Græca Majora, (Odes and Critical Extracts,) Moral Philosophy, (Paley's,) Constitution of the United States, (Bayard's,) Lectures on International Law, Butler's Analogy, Olmstead's Natural Philosophy, Astronomy (Herschell's,) Geology (Hitchcock's.)

There is a regular exercise in reading or declamation, once a week, continued through the whole course,—the Senior and Junior Classes delivering original speeches.

### COMMENCEMENT—VACATIONS—EXAMINATIONS.

The Annual Commencement will be held on the last Thursday of September, in each year. An examination of each class will take place at the close of each term. The College year is divided into two terms of five months each. The first commences on the first Monday in November and terminates on the last Wednesday in March. The second commences on the first Monday in May, and terminates on the last Thursday in September.

### TUITION.

The Tuition Fee is \$15, per session. As it is very desirable that students should enter at the beginning of a session, to commence their studies with their respective classes, no deduction from the tuition fee will be made in favor of any who may enter after the commencement of a session or a term, before the first two months of it have expired. Those who may enter after the first two months of a session, will be charged in proportion to the part of it that may then remain.

**EXPENSES.**

It is impossible to make an accurate estimate of the expenses of a student. Much depends on his previous tastes and habits, and on the responsibility to which a parent or a guardian may hold him for the expenditure of the money with which he may be entrusted. The ordinary charges, in the town, for board, including lodging, washing, lights, and fuel, are from \$2,00 to 2,50 per week. Any young man wishing to pursue his studies for the Gospel Ministry, by furnishing testimonials of his character and standing as to piety, talents, and indigence, can procure a Scholarship of \$60 per annum, to enable him to defray the expenses of his education.

**GENERAL RULES.**

All students are required to be present at Prayers in the College Chapel; to recite a Bible lesson on Sabbath, and to attend preaching once on that day; to avoid all profaneness and vice of every species; to observe in all their deportment those principles of benevolence and integrity, which are essential to the comfort of every well regulated community; to exhibit diligence and energy in their studies, and to abstain from every thing that tends to injure their own interests or their general welfare.

## DANVILLE FEMALE INSTITUTE.

THE next Session in this Institution will commence on **Monday, the 4th of November next**, and continue twenty weeks.—  
Course of instruction thorough and extensive.

*(P. All branches are taught—and no pupil will be allowed to receive instructions from any teacher not connected with the Institution.)*

### TERMS.

Tuition, per session, . . . . .	\$3, \$12, \$16
Music, . . . . .	25
Use of Instruments, . . . . .	3
French or Latin, . . . . .	12
Board, including Washing, Lights, &c. . . . .	50
Fuel, per month, . . . . .	25 cents.

Boarders leaving the the Institution before the close of the Session, will be charged at the rate of \$3 per week.

*(P. Experience has taught the necessity of requiring all pupils who are from their parents, to board in the Institution, unless they can be with a relative, as near as grand parent. Therefore, no pupil from abroad can be received, unless she boards in the Institution, or can be with a grand parent or aunt.)*

Tuition will be required in advance, invariably, by either cash or negotiable notes.

No pupil will attend a party during the session, and no one will be retained in the Institution who will not comply with the rules.
