Dear Sir:

We write you in regard to opening a street through the west end of the college campus to the stock yards. Possibly you are aware of the fact that we purchased five acres of ground lying broadside of the college, just back of the Terhune place. We have divided this lot; one-half of it we are using for warehouse purposes, fronting the railroad, and the other half we wish to front on a good broad street, running through the college on to Russell Street, and on to the stock yards. There is a great demand in Danville to have a street leading from Walnut Street to the stock yards, without having to go nearly a mile around to get to them. The opening of this street and the opening of Russell Street would put the college grounds in a solid square.

If you should assist us in opening this street, most of the land would come off of us, except right in front. We will agree to sell off residence lots only, and if we put up houses ourselves, put up nice buildings fronting the college campus.

In the event we cannot get your co-operation in this, we will be compelled to put up houses fronting a street that we will open up, splitting our lot in two. This will give the back premises of these lots against the college, which we think would not be pleasant for the college authorities. We have also had a nice offer for this lot, to
