HISTORY.

WHEN any Institution has become venerable with age and replete with usefulness, it is highly gratifying to its intimate friends, and may be interesting to the public, to know something of its origin, and the means by which it has attained to such eminence and usefulness.

The Chamberlain Philosophical and Literary Society of Centre College was founded on February 22d, 1823, and denominated—The Literary and Philosophical Society of Centre College.

The name under which it is now incorporated, was assumed in 1826, upon the occasion of Rev. Dr. CHAMBERLAIN'S resignation of the Presidency of the College, in order to perpetuate the memory of a devout christian, a faithful teacher, and a distinguished man.

Our Constitution, which an experience of thirty-seven years has required to be but slightly revised, was framed by our worthy President, L. W. GREEN, our estimable towns-

man, JOHN A. JACOBS, Principal Deaf and Dumb Asylum, and Mr. ROBERT HOLEMAN.

The objects of the Society were—"the improvement of its members in Literature, Elocution, and Morals," the last being not the least end contemplated. Members were held responsible for daily conduct outside of the Hall; no question unimportant or of an immoral tendency, was allowed to be discussed, and the Society was always opened and closed with prayer. Thus was this noble enterprise, like all enterprises for the elevation and happiness of mankind, inaugurated as if in the presence-chamber of that Being whose eye glances through all disguises, whose presence pervades all space, and whose omnipotence can establish what can never be overthrown! The minutes of each meeting bore testimony to the recognition of His presence, in the formula—"Under the kind Providence of God the Society again assembled, &c."

The noble spirits that gradually moulded our beloved Society into symmetry, while yet in its plastic state, filled with the high resolve, the intellectual vigor, and the ardent philanthropy of youth, seem to have breathed into its corporate form their own living spirit, and to have stamped upon it their own indelible impress, which has descended to us as a sacred legacy.

The first regular meeting of the Society, at which nineteen members were present, was held on Nov. 1st, 1823.

The prosperity of Chamberlain Society has not been uninterrupted; but, like the giant oak that withstands the blast, she has taken a deeper root and a firmer hold at every storm of adversity. Her numbers have varied between thirteen

and eighty; her treasury has gravitated from some pounds lighter than emptiness, to some scores of pounds above all ordinary necessities, but she has never wanted strong arms, brave hearts, and devoted friends, in every hour of peril, and we trust that among her thousand sons sent forth to the battle of life, more than enough will always be ready to supply all her wants, perpetuate her memory, and vindicate her fame.

The 22d of February has been our annual celebration day from the beginning, and in this we cordially unite with our sister Societies to crown with triune honors the natal day of "The Father of His Country,"—a day of still additional interest to us, because it is the birth-day of our Constitution.

The Diplomas of the Society are granted upon much the same conditions as those of the College. Our Society numbers at present about seventy-five regular members. Our Hall is large, beautiful, and commodious. A benevolent gentleman from each of the three cities, Louisville, Lexington, and Maysville, contributed funds to form the nucleus of our Library, which now comprises more than two thousand volumes of standard works, and to which large additions of recent works are annually being made.

In short, our Society is more, every way, than its founders could have anticipated, even in the ardor of youthful aspiration, and, perhaps, all that we can reasonably desire, though we still press forward toward a higher position, which shall be commensurate with the ever-advancing spirit of the times.

The pulpit, the bar, the forum, all the honorable pursuits of life, bear record to the utility and efficiency of the Society

which we delight to honor; and with such a record of the past, such prosperity in the present, and such bright prospects for the future,

Onward still with cheerful courage,
Press we to the shining goal;
Ever striving and achieving,
Strong of arm and brave of soul.
