and settled at Xenia, Ohio, where he became Judge of the Court of Common Pleas. Moore, who studied for the ministry, died in 1852. McDill became a minister in the United Presbyterian Church, and rounded out a long record of service as Professor in the Xenia Theological Seminary.

While faculty-fraternity relations on many campuses were often embedding of the complete outlawed fraternities completely, this was not the case at Centre. From the outset, and throughout its history, Epsilon of Beta Theta Pl was nevepted by the faculty and operated free of stringent regulation. The year 1862 is a memorable one. The Civil War was raging the Confederate Army. With many of its undergraduates and alumni in the armed forces. Epsilon itself became a war casualty, and in 1862 ceased to function. Her soldier sons served with distinc-

Following its reactivation in 1871, Epsilion of Beta Theta Pi steadily progressed, and within a few years equalled its per-war record.
