Y. W. C. A.

The very first thing that every girl should know on entering Kentucky College for Women, is that there is a Y. W. C. A., to which every girl and woman can belong. It is a world-wide and inter-denominational association, the purpose of which is, "To create, maintain and extend throughout the school, a strong, high moral sentiment; to bring students into a personal relation to Jesus Christ as Sav-

ior and friend; to build them up in Christian character, to lead them to be loyal to the Church of Christ as in obedience to his commandments, and to prepare them for future Christian service." The National Motto for the Y. W. C. A., is, "I came that they may have life, and may have it abundantly." The membership in the United States is 253,406. The only way we can make this Association worthy of its name is by the help of all the girls. For the Association may be considered as one body in Christ, the girls are the different members of this body. This Association is in the hands of the students and the meetings are lead by the students. So there is always a sympathetic crowd with the leaders.

MEMBERSHIPS

The Active Memberships of the Association consists of students who are members of Protestant Churches and are over fifteen years of age.

The Association Membership consists of students who are not members of a Church and are under fifteen years of age.

The Membership dues are one dollar a year and these dues must be paid on October the twenty-first, PAY DAY.

It shall be the duty of each member to co-operate heartily in carrying out the purpose of this Association.

MEETINGS

The Young Women's Christian Association holds its devotional meeting each Wednesday at 2:30 o'clock in the Y. W. C. A. room. Everyone should attend each meeting, for she will miss something if she stays away.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Kentucky College for Women has the distinction of being the only college in the State in which there is a Sunday School carried on by the students. The teachers are girls chosen from the student body as are the officers. Every student in college is enrolled and the attendance is unusually regular. The teachers have a teachers' training class which meets each Saturday, and the lesson for the fol-

lowing Sunday is taught by the Bible teacher.

The Sunday School is of vital importance to each girl. It is alive and doing good work in the keeping of Kentucky College standards.

MISSION STUDY

One of the important departments of the Y. W. C. A. is the Missionary Committee. This committee is composed of the Mission Class teachers, who have under their direction the nine courses of mission study that the Y. W. C. A. offers and all other Missionary activities of the Association. The Mission Study Courses open up a big field of usefulness to the student and give plentiful opportunity for interesting study.

The nine courses are:

1. Mexico and the Latin American Countries.
2. Medical Missions.
3. China.
4. City Missions.
5. Mormonism.
6. Mountain Work.
7. Turkey and the Mohammedan Countries.

8. India.

9. Negro Problem in the South.

HONOR SYSTEM

The school has been controlled for two years by the Honor System. This system consists of two phases; the Honor Roll and the Honor Board. Girls may become members of the Honor Roll by signing a pledge which puts them on their honor in all phases of school life. The conduct and standing in classes determines whether she remains on the Honor Roll or not. The Honor Board which controls the school, consists of ten members: Mrs. Acheson, the chairman, four faculty members appointed by the president, and five Honor Board girls nominated by the faculty and elected by the Honor Roll girls.

ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

All new girls should join the Association. Every well rounded girl should have an interest in the Athletics as well as other phases of college life. Many different kinds of athletic sports are offered to the students. A modern gymnasium building has recently been built which contains a swimming pool, bowling alley, track

and large basket ball floor. There are three good tennis courts on the campus kept in condition by the Association and for the use of the Association girls.

The basket ball season begins about the last of November. The contending parties are the Cherokees composed of the girls in the odd classes, 1915 and 1917; and the Wahpanooches, the even classes, 1916 and 1918. The Cherokee colors are yellow and black. The Wahps, red and blue. Every new girl should identify herself with the side to which her class belongs and either go out and try for the team, or wear her colors and "root" at the time of the game. The two teams are now contending for a shield. Each year the winning team is the one which wins two games out of three. In 1913 the Cherokees won; the Wahps won in 1914; so next year decides the winner of the shield.

In the spring the girls play baseball and have a match game between two teams, the captains of which are chosen by the gymnasium instructor.

About the first of May there is a track meet. The President each year offers a silver loving cup to the winner of most points on this occasion. Each spring the association gives a banquet to its members and the faculty. At this time each girl who has made the basket ball team for one or more games is presented with the School "Letter."

Any one may join the association by giving her name to the secretary of the association at the first meeting in the fall. At this meeting the officers for the new year are elected. They are chosen by the girls from the student body. At this meeting an executive committee is appointed, composed of the four new officers, Mrs. Acheson and the gymnasium teacher.

This committee takes charge of the funds of the association and conducts its business.

SCHOOL REGULATIONS

1. Visits will not be made nor received during study hours nor on Sabbath, but visits from parents or friends will be welcomed on Saturday.

2. Meals are served in the rooms in case of sickness at the cost of 15 cents per meal.

3. One hour and fifteen minutes in the afternoon and two hours in the evening are set apart for the preparation of lessons.

4. Girls are allowed to go calling once during the week, chaperoned by an Honor Board Member.

5. The shopping line goes to town once each week. The second and third floor lines take alternate weeks to shop. A special shopping line goes once each week. Things that are to be fitted must be brought at this time. One must put in a request to go in this line.

6. The entertainment of visitors is a privilege granted to members of the household, when it is convenient to the management.

7. Each girl may spend two Saturdays of each month in town with friends. The invitation must come

through the office. No pupil may spend the night away from the college except under the chaperonage of parent or guardian.

8. Do not deface the walls with tacks, nails or by pasting any article whatsoever thereon. Suspend all streamers, pictures and other decorations from the moulding.

9. All students are urged to make deposits in College Bank. It teaches accuracy and economy.

10. The President's office is the front room to the left in the East Dormitory.
